PASTOR'S REPORT: Rev. Inger Manchester reported that she is looking at a program entitled, Text 'Em All, that would send out emergency or time sensitive information to folks in the Congregation who opt in. The program cost would be ~\$40 a month. Discussion ensued.

### CLERK'S REPORT:

(MOTION) approve minutes of Stated Meeting 9/19/23.

November/December Stated Session Meeting 11/28/23. Note: No Session Mtg. in December.

STEWARDSHIP/FINANCE: Elder Mac Lumpkin presented a positive Stewardship Committee Report and presented the draft Stewardship letter to be sent to the Congregation in preparation for Commitment Sunday 11/12/23, which Session approved.

## MINISTRY TEAM AND COMMITTEE REPORTS/MOTIONS:

- Elder Mary Hopkins (Worship Ministry Team) brought a motion to approve the following single Service dates, which Session approved: 11/26/23 to decorate for advent; 12/31/23 as Inger is on vacation 12/27/23, 12/28/23, and 12/31/23 (there will be a supply pastor on 12/31/23); 1/28/24 for our RPC Annual Meeting; and 2/18/24 as Inger will be on vacation. She also brought a motion for a single 10:00 a.m. Service on 12/24/23 to focus on both being the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Advent and Christmas Eve and one 5:00 p.m. Service on that same date, which Session approved.
- Elder Sandy Gallagher (Outreach Ministry Team) reported the Hope's Legacy Event on 10/7/23 raised \$2,200 for that organization.
- Elder Bill Iverson (Mission Ministry Team) reported 1) The RPC Missions Booklet that describes all our church's Missions activities has been completed and will be used in the Stewardship campaign. It will be uploaded to RPC's website for all to read, 2) The Head Start Christmas Party will be Sunday, 12/3/23, at 3:30PM and Bright Stars, Head Start, and the Community choir children will be invited. This will be led by Ann Mische, 3) Preparations are beginning and names are being collected for Thanksgiving food baskets, and 4) The Committee will be reviewing all local extramural spending to determine if we should be reducing the total number and increasing donations to those who we feel are accomplishing the most in helping others.
- Elder Kathy Kristiansen (Liaison Grounds Ministry Team) reported for Mike Smythers, Chair, that mowing continues and plantings around the office/playground will be scheduled for late fall. Mike Smythers will be stepping down from this Ministry Team and a new chair will soon emerge.
- Elder Susan Luscomb (Christian Education Ministry Team) reported that the Youth Ministry Team will be joined with CEMT and fall under one 'umbrella'. She with support of Dana Ogilvie brought the following motion: 1. The functions of the Youth Committee as created in 2023 be returned to the Christian Education Ministry Team, effective 1/1/2024; 2. That for purposes of the budget, the line items which appear under the Youth Committee be included among the line items of the Education Ministry; and 3. That the Youth Committee as a separate committee of Session be dissolved until such time as Session deems appropriate. Session approved this.
