We voted to partner with Here to Stay Wintergreen (HSW) to explore starting a Respite program for caregivers at RPC. This is still in the information gathering phase.

Our next meeting will be at 4 PM on Monday, March 4, 2024, and anyone interested in helping or learning more about our work is welcome to attend.

Do You Love Me? - Feed My Sheep.

The One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) special offering of the Presbyterian Church USA began 75 years ago in response to an appeal on a Saturday evening national radio broadcast asking Americans to give generously to their churches the next morning. More than 75,000 churches responded. This ecumenical response to worldwide needs has continued since.

The PC(USA) offerings received through OGHS are roughly divided into three categories. Self-Development of People, Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, and the Presbyterian Hunger Program (PHP) are the organization each receiving 32 percent of the offering. The remaining four percent goes to the PHP for its work on homelessness and affordable housing. This year the needs worldwide seem especially critical because of wars and displacements around the world. Christ said "Do you love Me? Feed My sheep." These words were repeated three times. Such simple words. Such a wonderful opportunity to reach out and make a difference in peoples' lives!

Rockfish Presbyterian Church will receive the OGHS offering on Easter Sunday, March 31.

Smoke Alarms at RPC It certainly was *alarming* to hear the sirens go off on Sunday, Feb 17, especially when the two primary contact people, were not present (Ken Engebretson & Nancy Johnson). Luckily, several folks jumped in and were able to silence the system and turn around the First Responders before they arrived. 27 smoke detectors are in place around the building, along with 9 water detectors at key locations. The base station is located on a wall shelf in the Narthex to the left of the front doors. It is a small white "cone" with a blue light emanating at its base. So what actions need to be taken if this happens again? Go to the base station location and follow the instructions on the sheet that is now next to it!

Session Highlights 2/21/24

Moderator Rev. Inger Manchester called the Session Meeting to order at 6:15 pm with prayer. Prayers were asked for Betty Marker, Richard Bryant Family, Kelly, Aaron and Pat Dawson.

The meeting was opened with devotions and prayer by Elder Mac Lumpkin.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Rev. Inger Manchester gave an update on the Respite program being considered. A committee is being formed to hopefully address any questions in advance and asked if any Elders would like to participate. Elder Bill Iverson volunteered to serve on the committee. The church will be sponsoring a 2-day Vacation Bible School this summer and is in the planning stage. Volunteers are needed.

CLERK'S REPORT:

- Approved minutes of Congregational Meeting 1/28/24.

STEWARDSHIP/FINANCE: Elder Mac Lumpkin presented the Monthly Financial Reports, Income and Balance Sheet. Stewardship Committee did not meet in February.

NEW BUSINESS: Elders Bill Iverson and Mac Lumpkin gave a report to Session on the POJ meeting of February 17, 2004. The POJ will now require Boundary Training with compliance by June 1st, 2024.

MINISTRY TEAM AND COMMITTEE REPORTS/MOTIONS:

- Elder Mary Hopkins (Worship Ministry Team) There is still a need for Technology Lead/Communications and small team for Service video/posting support.
- Hydrangea signup for Easter begins Feb. 25th, contributors can take home on Easter or following week. Key Dates:

- March 24 Palm Sunday Chimes, Children's Choir and Trumpets are planned.

- March 31 Easter Sunday Sunrise in pavilion @ 6:45 am & 10 am in Sanctuary full Chancel Choir is planned.
- April 7 Single 10:00 am Service
- May 19 Pentecost Chimes are planned.
- Elder Sandy Gallagher (Outreach Ministry Team) reported that the Talent Show will be held sometime later in the year. Formation of the new "Where We Are" Support Group is still a work in progress.
 - Rev. Inger Manchester will facilitate these meetings. There were 12 attendees at the initial meeting. A Mission Statement will be drafted and sent out for Outreach member's input. The group is meeting every two weeks. A plan is being discussed in conjunction with Here-To-Stay-Wintergreen of a respite care center for clients of caregivers. This would take place at RPC on a weekly basis for 4 hours at a time. Clients would be driven to the church and would then possibly attend a combination of social, physical and spiritual activities in order to allow caregivers some much needed free time.
- Elder Bill Iverson (Mission Ministry Team) reported the committee will contribute funds from Discretionary Funds to Here-to-Stay-Wintergreen to purchase Respite Program Training Modules. Viewing these will enable a more thorough understanding of how to run a program so a recommendation can be made to Session whether to pursue this initiative. It is not a commitment to establish a program. Linda Smyser will be leading the Easter food basket project this year. The Missions committee supported the PACEM programs at Westminster and Mt. Tabor Presbyterian Churches with food gift cards. This program also provides evening housing and a meal for homeless people during the winter months.
- Elder Susan Luscomb (Christian Education Ministry Team) reported the committee is thinking of adding more staff to
 cover the growth in children's attendance and the varying age differences of those children. In three weeks the
 Sunday School class will start a new book called "Jesus Revealed", focusing on the six "I AM" statements in the
 Gospel of John. The book will be supplemented by a short video each week delving into the imagery and mystery of
 each of these statements.
- Elder Susan Luscomb (Liaison Congregational Life) highlighted the following functions which fall under this ministry besides the Fellowship Hour each Sunday following the 10:00am service. The Meal Ministry provides meals that Rev. Inger takes with her when she visits folks. This is much appreciated by those who receive the meals. The Card Ministry sends cards to those struggling with illness, death and caregiving responsibilities as well as happy milestones such as birthdays and anniversaries. The Memorial Reception Committee provides or helps in providing receptions following funerals at the church. Volunteers are always needed and greatly appreciated to help in these ministries. Contact Sue Fulton.
- Elder Kathy Kristiansen (Liaison Grounds Ministry) reported Creation Appreciation recently removed the leaves from
 our grounds, normally done by volunteers, and will attempt to grow an attractive grass lawn in our cemetery. We are
 in the process of acquiring a quote for tree work. To Do list includes pruning/thinning, cleaning up around grave
 sites, mulching and labeling historic plantings. Aaron Harris will be our grounds keeper/lawn service this year. Mitch
 Fitzgerald will plow snow as needed.
