

NEW BUSINESS: Elder Dave Lawson participated in a Special Called POJ meeting on 9-26-24 via zoom and reported the meeting was budgetary discussing paid positions of the Presbytery.

MINISTRY TEAM AND COMMITTEE REPORTS/MOTIONS:

- Elder Mary Hopkins (Worship Ministry Team) presented MOTION to approve two Services on Christmas Eve, Dec.24<sup>th</sup>. One at 4:00p.m. (children focused) and one at 6:00pm. APPROVED. Upcoming Key Dates: Nov. 3<sup>rd</sup>, All Saints Day to recognize those who passed away since last year. Nov. 24<sup>th</sup> to welcome Elk Hill Pastor Nia (Harold Mears) as guest Sermon speaker. Hanging of the Greens Nov. 24<sup>th</sup> after the 10:00 am service. Wednesday Advent Services will be held at 5:30 pm on Dec. 4<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup>. There is a need to recruit additional ushers for Christmas Eve Services.
- Elder Mary Hopkins (Liaison for Christian Life) reported Sue Fulton has ordered a 100 cup coffee maker for the fellowship hour following the 10:00 am service. Volunteers are still needed to help make coffee and cleanup afterward.
