

## Passover Seder Coming April 9- the Wed before Holy Week

The Last Supper (we celebrate Maundy Thursday) was a Passover meal that Jesus shared with his disciples. At the last supper Jesus took the two elements bread and wine and connected them to His blood and His body. This is how we celebrate communion.

Exodus 12:14 "This is a day you are to commemorate; for the generations to come you shall celebrate it as a festival to the Lord—a lasting ordinance. 15 For seven days you are to eat bread made without yeast. On the first day remove the yeast from your houses, for whoever eats anything with yeast in it from the first day through the seventh must be cut off from Israel. 16 On the first day hold a sacred assembly, and another one on the seventh day. Do no work at all on these days, except to prepare food for everyone to eat; that is all you may do. 17 "Celebrate the Festival of Unleavened Bread, because it was on this very day that I brought your divisions out of Egypt. Celebrate this day as a lasting ordinance for the generations to come. 18 In the first month you are to eat bread made without yeast, from the evening of the four-teenth day until the evening of the twenty-first day. 19 For seven days no yeast is to be found in your houses. And anyone, whether foreigner or native-born, who eats anything with yeast in it must be cut off from the community of Israel. 20 Eat nothing made with yeast. Wherever you live, you must eat unleavened bread.

The Seder meal is a ritual that was developed by the rabbis after the destruction of the Temple in 70 C.E. Our Jewish brothers and sisters celebrate this meal each year. Peggy Gupp, a friend of our congregation who is Jewish, would like to share the Seder traditions with us and help us to make the stories of Exodus come alive. There will be limited seating so please sign up when you see the sheet come out. Children are encouraged as it is a fun family feast. I am so excited about this opportunity for understanding and sharing in God's Providence!

On Sunday, February 16 Mary Jane Winter (former interim pastor at RPC) will be at Rockfish Presbyterian to share with the congregation about her work with CEDEPCA (Protestant Center for Pastoral Studies in Central America). CEDEPCA is a global partner of the Presbyterian Church. This organization works to educate, empower and create lasting change in the lives of the people of Guatemala. Mary Jane will be talking with the adult Sunday School at 9 am (everyone is welcome), she will be at the 10 o'clock service and she will be sharing with the congregation during the fellowship time after the service about her work and mission trips in Guatemala. This will be a wonderful way to learn

more about this important work and the possibilities of future mission trips. In the past (pre COVID), RPC sent many mission groups to Guatemala with CEDEPCA.

The Presbytery of the James currently has the following mission trip planned with CEDEPCA:

July 14-21 and will focus on Earth Care and the Environment. This trip will feature an opportunity to plant trees with our Guatemalan friends in a reforestation effort, distribute water filters where there is no clean water in homes and learn about important connections to the Earth from indigenous women and men. PASTOR'S REPORT: Rev. Inger Manchester suggested holding a Session retreat for Session members to present/ discuss each ministry's goals and/or concerns for 2025. She will send out email to determine interest. Kerry Foster, Interim General Presbyter, has been invited to RPC to meet with Session for a Called Meeting Feb. 9<sup>th</sup>.

#### CLERK'S REPORT:

Session Approved the minutes from the following meetings: Stated 11-19-24, Called 12-8-24. Approved Clerk's Statistical Report for General Assembly. Approved election of Elders Roger Fulton & Sue Nichols as Co-Treasurers for 2025. Approved Cathy LeGrow as Clerk for 2025. Approved Elder Sandy Gallagher as Co-Chair of the 2025 Nominating Committee. Approved Elder Jeri Engebretson to serve as Commissioner for POJ Stated Meeting 2-15-25. Approved ratified email vote approving Inclement Weather Policy and Approved ratified email vote approving the Baptism of Mike Thibault.

STEWARDSHIP/FINANCE: Elder Dave Lawson presented the Monthly Financial Reports, I&E Statement and Balance Sheet. Session **APPROVED 2025 Budget as presented.** Increases in the budget were well explained and justified. Pledges for 2025 show a 22% increase.

- Elder Nancy Johnson (Facilities Management Team) reported discussion on updating Facility Use form for outside organizations using RPC.
- Elder Jeri Engebretson (Christian Education Ministry Team) reported all Sunday School classes are well attended and Adult classes have received names – "Food for Thought", held in the education room and "Practicing the Way', held in the library. The second Sunday of the month is designated for Mission Work by our Youth Missions. The younger children will pack food bags for the Nelson Food Pantry and the middle schoolers will work on disaster relief kits. Change in evening meeting days – Wednesday evening groups will now meet on Tuesday evenings. Lent/Advent Services will still be held on Wednesdays.
- Elder Sally Bryant (Missions Ministry Team Liaison) Elder Ann Mische presented the following MOTIONS: 1 To approve from unallocated unrestricted funds payments to assist the victims of the California fires and Hurricane Helene: 2 To approve combining the Helping Hands funds and Emergency funds as one line item. Both MOTIONS APPROVED. The team is working on setting up a Survey Monkey to assess our congregation's skills & interests to serve our local community. On Feb. 16<sup>th</sup>, Mary Jane Winter will share information at the 10am service regarding upcoming trips to Guatemala through CEDEPCA & POJ.
