The plan for our first outdoor service is for a 6:45 am Sunrise service on Easter morning. So spectacular to know that it is Easter, the Sun is rising and the Son has Risen! We give thanks for such a beautiful setting in which we worship the Living God.

I have been reading through the Bible and am now in Exodus and the building of the Tabernacle. God really pays attention to the details. It got me thinking about where we feel God is best worshiped. Is it on the move as was the case for the Israelites? God leading them with a cloud and fire? Is it in a beautiful Temple as was built by Solomon- not because God wanted it but because we the people felt we needed to build it to proclaim God's importance and glory? May we never forget that Our God lives amongst those in the places of power and in places ourselves may fear to trod. With the wealthy, with the poor, with the documented, with the undocumented, with those in health and those who are sick. God hears the cries of those in prisons, in hospitals, in hospice, in war torn countries and in orphanages.

May we never close our eyes to God's presence amongst and around us. May we also have a heart to hear God's call to us no matter where we find ourselves. May we look upon each other with loving hearts that recognize this Holy connection through the Spirit that has no bounds.

Passover Seder

Exodus 12:14 "This is a day you are to commemorate; for the generations to come you shall celebrate it as a festival to the Lord—a lasting ordinance. 15 For seven days you are to eat bread made without yeast. On the first day remove the yeast from your houses, for whoever eats anything with yeast in it from the first day through the seventh must be cut off from Israel. 16 On the first day hold a sacred assembly, and another one on the seventh day. Do no work at all on these days, except to prepare food for everyone to eat; that is all you may do. 17 "Celebrate the Festival of Unleavened Bread, because it was on this very day that I brought your divisions out of Egypt. Celebrate this day as a lasting ordinance for the generations to come. 18 In the first month you are to eat bread made without yeast, from the evening of the fourteenth day until the evening of the twenty-first day. 19 For seven days no yeast is to be found in your houses. And anyone, whether foreigner or native-born, who eats anything with yeast in it must be cut off from the community of Israel. 20 Eat nothing made with yeast. Wherever you live, you must eat unleavened bread.

Our Jewish brothers and sisters celebrate the Passover Seder each year. Peggy Watts Gup, a friend of our congregation who is Jewish, would like to share the Seder traditions with us and help us to make the stories of Exodus come alive. This will be on April 9 @ 5:30 pm. There will be limited seating so please sign up when you see the sheet come out. Children are encouraged as it is a fun family feast.

MINISTRY TEAM AND COMMITTEE REPORTS/MOTIONS:



- Elder Nancy Johnson (Facilities Management Team) reported pews have been cleaned and arrangements have been made to clean pew cushions. A contract has been signed for new carpeting.
