I've been thinking a lot about callings lately. God is active in each of our lives and asking us to do different things all for God's purpose. Sometimes the callings are comfortable and many times the calling is not. I am not convinced that God is very concerned with our comfort. In fact, maybe it is on our edges that we do our best work for the Lord.

The thing is when we are comfortable we tend to think we are the ones in control. I have been rereading the Old Testament and right now I am in 1 Samuel. Saul has been chosen as king and so far Saul has been trying to follow God (it is early on and God has been leading Israel into victory in battle so win win) But then Samuel the prophet is late showing up to guide Saul before a battle. So Saul takes things into his own hands and provides a burnt offering to the Lord. Seems good intentioned, right? Well - 13:13 And Samuel said to Saul, "You have done foolishly. You have not kept the commandment of the Lord your God, which He commanded you. For now the Lord would have established your kingdom over Israel forever. 14 But now your kingdom shall not continue. The Lord has sought for Himself a man after His own heart, and the Lord commanded him to be commander over His people, because you have not kept what the Lord commanded you."

My first reaction is, wow, harsh! But then I realized that it's not about what Saul wants or what I want - it is about the plans that the Lord has. And those plans are beyond our understanding. When we second guess or worse, move forward on our own without God, then we actually bring God's plan backwards.

So to bring this into today's world, we do know some things about how God desires God's plan to move forward. It is not through a warhorse but through a Lamb. It is not through the Empire but the Heavenly Kingdom. It is not through coercion but rather planting seeds. Our job is not to fix the world. Our job is to discern what the Spirit is placing in front of us to deal with. Love your neighbor. Love your enemy. Sacrifice yourself and your own will and pride so that you can serve the One who has the greater plan in mind. In the study we just finished "Luke In the Land" the author Kristi McLelland quoted a pastor she had heard once say "We gather to scatter to wash the feet of our cities".

Let us at Rockfish scatter!
